State & Local Government Law	On January 14, 2014, the Supreme Court issued its unanimous opinion in Mississippi ex rel. Hood v. AU Optronics Corp. relating to the removability of certain cases from State to Federal Court under the Class Action Fairness Act ("CAFA"). The Supreme Court ruled that because Mississippi was the only named plaintiff in the enforcement action, the matter did not qualify as a "mass action" - a civil action in which monetary compensation is sought on behalf of 100+ persons -- under "CAFA." This ruling effectively prevents a party from removing most, if not all, of the traditional State Attorneys General enforcement cases to Federal Court. While the Supreme Court's decision centered upon the text of the CAFA statute, our panelists of experts, including the Mississippi Attorney General, will discuss the scope and breadth of a state's parens patriae authority, the federalism issues related to state Attorneys General actions under CAFA, and the impact of the Supreme Court's ruling on multi-state enforcement actions.
