On the move


After nearly 20 years in the same downtown location, Milwaukee-based Gonzalez Saggio & Harlan LLP moved its headquarters this month to improve firm efficiency.

As of January 23, the national, minority-owned law firm had relocated from the Mackie Building at 225 E. Michigan St. to the Chase building at 111 E. Wisconsin Ave., Suite 1000.

When the firm came to the Mackie Building in 1993, it only had two attorneys and occupied a small portion of the fourth floor, according to marketing director Pam Bertieri. Since then, the firm's Milwaukee office has grown to 50 lawyers and took up the entire third and fourth floors of the Mackie Building, along with parts of the fifth and a portion of the fourth floor in the adjoining Mitchell Building.

The firm will occupy the entire tenth floor of the Chase building on Wisconsin Avenue, Bertieri said, and have room for additional conference areas and an evidence room. All contact information will remain the same.
